“Adam,

The E-mate has a bright future - and it is for this reason that I am pulling it back into Apple -which has the resources to market and sell it much more broadly. You can imagine that a small spin-off company would not have such a large sales force or marketing budget. With the appropriate investments in sales and marketing, we hope that the E-mate can become a great success.

We are a little more confused about the MessagePad. Since it costs more (\$1K or more vs \$700-799 for the E-mate) and has no keyboard, its market seems more limited than the E-mate. However, sales of the current MessagePad are brisk, so who knows... What do you think?

Don't worry - we are pulling this group back into Apple so that we can invest even more sales and marketing resources into these products, rather than dumping the products into a small spin-off which lacks such resources.

the mood is still cautionary, especially since recent cancellation of the Newton hand-held device. And a significant amount of Apple talent is fleeing the Mac platform to do something they never thought possible: embrace the world of Windows.

"It is make-or-break time," said Daniel Kunstler, senior equity analyst with J.P. Morgan Securities. "An eroding tech business is an oxymoron. It doesn't stay in business long. They're close to that bedrock, and their revenues have to bounce off that bedrock and start to rise again."

Apple executives last week declined to discuss the company's fortunes. But a spokeswoman hinted the cone of silence might soon be lifted. Three upcoming events — an



Einstein Emulator
